

00:00 Opener Porsche Carrera Cup

00:19 The Porsche Carrera Cup Germany visits the Sachsenring. The world's oldest and most legendary one-make cup returns to action on a circuit that matches its tradition. 0 to 100 km/h in 3 seconds thanks to 485 HP and a host of emotion.

00:40 Only five race weekends will be staged this year due to the coronavirus, but the race weekends include up to three races, as is the case at the Sachsenring. And we're off!

00:57 The circuit, about 30 kilometres west of Chemnitz, is rich in tradition. As early as 1927, hundreds of thousands of spectators saw motorcycle races at the Sachsenring, some of which included the city centre.

01:20 One of the most famous sections: the Badberg turn. The youngest drivers, supported by the Carrera Cup Germany's youth programme, the so-called Talent Pool, visit the turn this weekend.

01:37 SOT Kay van Berlo (EN), Nebulus Racing by Huber

01:51 The track back then: an 8.7-kilometre long blend of a city circuit on cobbles and narrow turns on the one hand and long straights on roads on the other hand. It is similar to Le Mans, where the Talent Pool drivers laid down a marker in the opener. Laurin Heinrich and Leon Köhler made it to the podium at the historic circuit in the west of France.

02:18 SOT Leon Köhler (DE), T3-HRT-Motorsport

First of all let me say Le Mans is one of the greatest tracks I've ever competed on. And to be so successful at this circuit is really special.

02:30 SOT Laurin Heinrich (DE), T3-HRT-Motorsport

Le Mans was an absolute highlight. I made it to the podium in my second Carrera Cup race and finished fourth overall, with 52 drivers competing. At this legendary circuit under difficult conditions: a superb experience.

- 02:43 A clear sign that Porsche's youth programme is bearing fruit. Experts comprehensively coach the young drivers in the Talent Pool, now in its third year. Media and mental training, fitness sessions and of course driving skills are on the schedule. Wolf Henzler is responsible for the latter.
- 03:05 SOT Wolf Henzler (DE), Driver Coach Porsche Talent Pool**
I guide the rookie drivers in the Talent Pool, I make sure the drivers get a grip in the Porsche as soon as possible. I also support them when they struggle on the track, when they aren't sure how to take certain turns. For instance, we watch onboard videos or moments from last year.
- 03:31 Toni Wolf has made it through the Talent Pool. The driver from Saxony lives close to the track and presents it from a driver's perspective.
- 04:35 SOT Toni Wolf (ENG), Overdrive Racing by Huber**
- 05:10 Guest driver Wolf set the ninth-fastest lap time in qualifying for Race 1, but a better result would have been possible. His fellow Huber driver Larry ten Voorde sealed pole position. But the latter is the freshly-crowned champion in the international Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup, which is staged with identical cars as a series supporting Formula 1.
- 05:37 SOT Larry Ten Voorde (DE), Nebulus Racing by Huber**
The last few years have shown it's always very tight here. Last year I had a nice and close fight with Michael Ammermüller. A few hundredths made the difference in qualifying. It's good that we're on pole here.
- 05:49 The second-fastest man in qualifying: Talent Pool driver Leon Köhler. The 21-year-old was less than one hundredth of a second short of the Dutchman.
- 06:03 But during their preparations for the start, there was a problem with the young German's Porsche. The power steering pump failed – 15 minutes before exiting the pits for the starting grid.

06:19 **SOT Leon Köhler (DE), T3-HRT-Motorsport**
I wasn't so nervous to be honest. I knew the team always do a good job, and that they'd manage, and that's what they did. Everything was fine.

06:31 It took exactly 15 minutes to repair the car, Köhler only just making it to the starting grid.

06:48 As the fastest in qualifying, ten Voorde takes up the 30-minute race (+ 1 lap) from pole position at the wheel of his 485 hp Porsche 911 GT3 Cup.

06:56 Start of the race: The champion of the Porsche Mobil 1 Supercup defends his top spot at the start. Pereira overtaking Köhler in the first corner.

07:15 First time through the Omega: Larry ten Voorde, Dylan Pereira, Leon Köhler, Diego Bertonelli and Julian Hanses on P5.

07:23 Onboard splitter cam: Joey Mawson, behind Toni Wolf

07:48 Replay start: the second place on the grid normally is a good one to overtake the pole setter, but Köhler is losing a position P2 -> P3

07:59 Replay start, onboard ten Voorde

07:59 Replay start, onboard Carlos Rivas, starting from P13, fighting with Kay van Berlo, starting from P12.

08:30 Lap 2: Felix Neuhofer fighting with Georgi Donchev (Onboard) for P13

08:58 Kay van Berlo and fellow-countryman Rudy van Buren fighting for P9. Van Buren overtaking van Berlo.

09:20 **SOT Rudy van Buren (ENG), CarTech Motorsport by Nigrin**

- 09:37 Rudy van Buren now overtaking van Joey Mawson for P8.
- 09:57 Onboard: Dylan Pereira right behind Larry ten Voorde, overtaking the Dutchman for P1
- 10:24** **SOT Dylan Pereira (DE), FÖRCH Racing**
Larry was very fair and left me enough space. He proved he's a fast driver when he won the Supercup title, and he's fair too. And I treat him as he treats me.
- 10:45 Onboard #15 Toni Wolf, touching the car of Kay van Berlo with his splitter cam and his car.
- 11:02 Onboard Larry ten Voorde, now under pressure by Leon Köhler.
- 11:13 Toni Wolf DNF
- 11:21 Penultimate lap, Larry ten Voorde, still under pressure from Leon Köhler.
- 11:34 Slow-motion: ProAm Category: Stefan Rehkopf overtaking Georgi Donchev who is spinning after a contact with Matthias Jeserich.
- 11:59 Last lap, last corner: Larry ten Voorde, still under pressure from Leon Köhler. Dylan Pereira wins. At the Sachsenring, the Luxembourger clinched his first victory in the German one-make cup. Larry ten Voorde (Netherlands/Nebulus Racing by Huber) achieved second place at the race on Saturday, with Leon Köhler (Deutschland/T3/HRT Motorsport) on third.
- 12:13 Onboard Pereira
- 12:22** **SOT Dylan Pereira (DE), FÖRCH Racing**
Larry was really fast for five laps, but I waited until the end. Then I was able to make up one to two tenths per lap, I thought I'd have a chance towards the end. And his tyres degraded significantly. That was good for me of course, although that didn't mean overtaking would be easy. It was a little risky but it worked out well, and I'm very glad about the victory.

12:50 Leon Köhler took the flag in third place after a turbulent race

12:57 SOT Leon Köhler (DE), T3-HRT-Motorsport
I made a few mistakes, I skidded a little here and there. But by and large I'm satisfied. I fought for second place towards the end. That didn't work but I've taken decent points.

13:15 Podium ceremony with Robert Lukas as team principal of FÖRCH Racing.

13:23 Pereira on the top spot.

13:27 The Talent Pool's debriefing after the first race: the young drivers watch the first race along with Wolf Henzler. The result: very good, the youngsters sealed P3 to P6.

13:44 SOT Wolf Henzler (DE), Driver Coach Porsche Talent Pool
I'm very pleased. Many of the Talent Pool drivers were among the top drivers and fought for the podium. One of them scored a podium finish, another one was close.

13:56 The drivers can further analyse the race in one-on-one conversations if they want. They get data on braking points, possibilities of overtaking, but also how to defend their position, and they appreciate their opportunities.

14:07 SOT Leon Köhler (DE), T3-HRT-Motorsport
It really helps us. On a weekend like this, it can always happen that we have problems and don't know what to do. So it's good to have Wolf Henzler, he supports us.

14:21 Larry ten Voorde again on pole position. He set the fastest second-fastest lap in qualifying session.

14:28 Leon Köhler on P2, 0.1 behind ten Voorde

- 21:30 Christoph Huber
- 21:32 Onboard: Leader Larry ten Voorde: In the last laps, his hottest pursuer Pereira lay in wait for his chance to overtake – in vain. Ten Voorde fended him off to take the flag in first place after 21 laps. Due to the time penalty of Köhler: Third place went to Diego Bertonelli (Fach Auto Tech) from the Porsche Carrera Cup Talent Pool. This was the Italian's first time on the podium in the German one-make cup. Julian Hanses (Förch Racing) from Germany finished on fourth with his 21-year-old compatriot from the district of Saxony Toni Wolf (Overdrive Racing by Huber) crossing the finish line in fifth on home turf.
- 22:07 SOT Larry Ten Voorde (DE), Nebulus Racing by Huber**
It went much better today but Dylan is still a bit faster than we are in the race. He put us under a lot of pressure but he was at the limit. He made a few mistakes here and there, I was able to extend the gap a little. I'm glad of course, for the team too.
- 22:25 After winning the season opener in Le Mans it's the second win for ten Voorde and the first podium for Diego Bertonelli in the German one-make series.
- 22:34 SOT Diego Bertonelli (ENG), FACH AUTO TECH**
- 22:44 Kay van Berlo's team have no reason to celebrate. The marshals transport the 911 to the paddock. The car must be repaired within four hours, but the damage is rather superficial. Van Berlo is confident he can compete in the third race.
- 23:05 SOT Kay van Berlo (ENG), Nebulus Racing by Huber**
- 23:10 And about two hours later his car is ready for the third and last race this weekend.

- 23:57 Safety Car deployed
- 24:03 Re-Start: Pereira, ten Voorde, Köhler, Hanses and Heinrich on P5.
- 24:08 Onboard Donchev fighting with Rehkopf overtaking the German.
- 24:16 Rivas leading in the ProAm category. After Matthias Jeserich winning race #2 it's the second ProAm victory for Rivas this weekend.
- 24:29 Onboard, splitter cam: Toni Wolf. Bertonelli in front of him off the track, damaging his tyre (inside rear right tyre)
- 24:41 Replay: Bertonelli
- 24:29 Onboard with Pereira, the Luxembourger clinching a lights-to-flag victory. Pursuer ten Voorde managed to keep the gap to less than one second over large stretches of the race but was unable to put any serious pressure on the Förch driver. After four of eleven races, ten Voorde from the Netherlands retains his top spot in the standings with 90 points. Pereira (79) and Köhler (60) rank second and third.
- 25:13 SOT Dylan Pereira (DE), FÖRCH Racing**
Two times P1 and one P2: we could have hardly done better.
- 25:17 SOT Larry Ten Voorde (DE), Nebulus Racing by Huber**
Your most recent result defines how famous you are. I was at the top this morning, I'm second now. So we must work hard until the races at the Red Bull Ring. But we're used to that, and I'm looking forward to it. Chin up and move on!
